

FOREWORD

We are all aware that the implementation of RTE Act 2009 in the states are not on the track. The justiciable fundamental Right to Education is still languishing neglect in terms of adherence to the norms and standards as enshrined in the RTE Act 2009. Though there have been improvements in many aspects of school education but the overall situation remains abysmal. Few reports inform that not more than 10 percent of the schools have fulfilled all the norms of the RTE Act. Under this pretext, it becomes important to know about the real condition of the schools, whether they are abiding by the norms laid down under the RTE Act or are they still not ready for universalisation of education.

There is a total of 14,45,807 schools imparting elementary education in India. These schools have 19, 766,6909 children from age 6 to 14. However, census 2011 data reveals that there are 233,583,108 children between ages of 6-14 which would mean that more than 35 million children are not enrolled in schools. Also, the DISE data further shows that there is a descending order of enrolment; students are decreasing in the schools, particularly in government schools.

The DISE data further reveals that the enrolment of vulnerable class children I.e. OBC, SC ST and Muslims are in decreasing order, particularly the girls.

Also, the data shows that unrecognised schools are still rampant in the community and adherence to RTE norms is not seen in terms of infra structure, trained teachers and school governance.

We are presenting the scoring of states on RTE indicators for a clear picture of school education.

We hope that this score ranking exercise will be of help to those who are keen to make positive dents in education goals.

We solicit your comments and suggestions to make this initiative more meaningful.



Regarding the privatisation education, it is also evident from the data that the numbers of private schools are increasing. While a few states exhibits an increase in the share of government schools to private schools, the national average data reveals that this percentage has decreased from 75. 51 in year 2015 to 74.75 compared to year 2015. This decrease in percentage share of government schools to the total schools could be attributed to the large number of school closure and mergers that took place in the year.

Comments: What is disturbing is that more schools were expected to be opened after the enforcement of RTE Act 2009. But more schools are being closed or merged and private schools are increasing gradually. Out of 36 states 26 have a descending number of govt schools.

While the importance of accountability and community participation has been lauded in the Act, it is also important to examine what the indicators suggest. Data reveals that there has been an increase in the formation of school management committee in schools from year 2014 to year 2015. In 2013-14, 91.08 percent of the schools had formed SMCs, which increased to 93.36. West Bengal shows a terrible situation where it has moved from 45.36 percent to 52.62 percent in year 2014 to 2015. Another indicator that needs to be mentioned here is the percentage of SMCs which have opened account. It was observed that this percentage has also slightly improved from 95.83 in 2014 to 96.92 in 2015. RTE Act lays upon the responsibility of preparing of School Development Plan on the School Management Committee; data reveals that 84.94 percent of the schools have been able to accomplish the task while 15.06 percent of the schools have failed to. Here too, West Bengal and Meghalaya have shown abysmally low results.



A lot of stress has been put on the importance of evaluation system both internationally and nationally. Lot of countries have introduced various evaluation methods to enhance the learning experience of children rather than having systems which could act retrogressive. The positive step taken through the RTE Act was the introduction of Continuous and comprehensive evaluation rather than one time examination. However, the implementation required training and support. Data projects that only 80 percent of the schools have been able to implement it. While few states like Chandigarh, Lakshadweep, Tamil Nadu, Chhattisgarh and Jammu and Kashmir shows complete or nearly complete implementation, states like Rajasthan, Manipur, Meghalaya and Tripura shows implementation below 20 percent, with Tripura and Meghalaya below 5 percent implementation.



Comments: Out of 36 states, only 4 states govt schools could maintain ascending order or stagnant in enrolment. Rest of the states show decreasing order in school enrolment in primary level. This is a most worrisome situation.



Talking about enrolment, it was observed that out of 36 states, only in 5 states govt schools could maintain an increase in or stagnant enrolment at a primary level. On the contrary, in private schools, only 3 out of 36 states/UTs show a decrease in enrolment. The descending trend in enrolment at Upper Primary level continues during 2013-14 to 14-15. Out of 36 states only 12 were able to maintain increased or constant enrolment. In Rest of the states there was a decreasing enrolment in government schools. In comparison to this only 7 states exhibits decreasing rate of enrolment at upper primary level while rest of the states showed an increase. Overall, at the elementary level, the percentages of enrolment in the government schools have decreased from 61.32 to 60.19 percent while the percentage of enrolment in private schools have increased from 35.81 to 37.21 from year 2013-14 to year 2014-15. There is a slight decrease in the percentage of enrolment of girls at the primary level, which have decreased from 48.20 to 48.19. Twenty two states have shown a decrease in the percentage share of girls' enrolment in primary schools, while 14 states have shown an increase. Similar decrease can be observed at the upper primary level where the percentage share of girls' enrolment has decreased from 48.66 to 48.63 percent.

terms of marginalised group enrolment, data reveals that though there is a slight increase in the percentage of enrolment of Schedule Caste the national average, a decrease in the percentage can be observed in a majority of 24 states. While Andhra Pradesh shows the highest increase in the percentage of children from Schedule Caste, Nagaland shows the highest decrease. Further, percentage of schedule tribe enrolment has decreased at the national average from 10.63 to 10.47 and the decrease can be noticed in thirteen states, with the highest decrease in D and N Haveli. In terms of ST girls, the decrease in percentage enrolment was even higher at .09 and the decrease can be observed in 16 states. With regards to Other Backward Castes, there is a slight improvement at the national level, but 13 states show decreased percentage in their enrolment. With regards to Muslim enrolment, there is a slight increase in the percentage of enrolment. However, 16 states show decrease in percentage enrolment. Additionally, Muslim girls' enrolment has decreased in the last one year both at national average as well as in 15 states.

Infrastructure of the schools also plays a vital role in providing quality education to all. Data from DISE report reveals that 96 percent of the schools have made drinking water available with Chandigarh, Dadra Nagar Havel, Daman and Diu, Delhi and Lakshadweep topping the list with every school having drinking water facilities. Meghalaya and Nagaland are the states with lowest parentage of schools having drinking water facility. With regards to separate toilets for girls, 92 percent of the schools have it. This has improved as compared to year 2013-14 when the percentage of schools with separate toilets for girls and boys were 87. In terms of schools having boundary wall, which has been recognised as one of the most important indicators of infrastructure as it provides safety to children, it was observed that only 65 percent of the schools have the boundary wall. After almost eight years of implementation of the RTE Act, huge percentage of schools still do not have the boundary wall! Similarly, only 60 percent of the schools have a playground.



Another important aspect would be to look at the status of teachers in the schools as they are one of the most prominent and important inputs for achieving quality education. It was observed from the data that percentage of single teacher schools at primary level have slightly decreased from 11.46 to 11.10 in year 2013-14 and year 2014-15 respectively. At the elementary level as well, there is a decrease from 8.32 to 8.07 percent of schools with single teachers. While the Act requires the Pupil teacher ratio in schools to be 30 for primary and 35 for upper primary, data shows that the national average stands at 25, while for both government and private schools, the PRT is 24. However, non academic involvement of government of teachers also needs to be evaluated for a better interpretation. In terms of professionally trained teachers, data reveals that 85.35 percent of the regular teachers in government schools and 73.5 percent of the regular teachers in private schools are professionally trained. For the contractual teachers, the percentage of professionally trained teacher is 60.07 in government schools as compared to 77 in private schools. However, it would be important here to mention that the percentage of regular teachers in government schools as compared to regular teachers in private schools would also be an important aspect to look into before interpretation.

National Coalition for Education (NCE) aspires to ensure inclusive and equitable quality education and lifelong learning opportunities for all.

Mission

National Coalition for Education (NCE) strives to advocate for the Right to Education for sustainable development with active participation of Civil Society Organisations, Teachers' Unions, Community and Policy makers to make education a reality for all by 2030.

Genesis

The creation of national coalition for education in India was highly influenced by the global political atmosphere on right to education. Beginning in 1990 with the Jomtien Conference and the adoption of the World Declaration on Education for All there has been a continued push to get every child into school. However, there was very little progress being made and ten years later, in 2000, the World Education Forum was held in Dakar, Senegal, and an agreement was made on the objective of having EFA by 2015. Six targets were set up stating that quality education should be available for free for everyone. One of the biggest players present at the forum was the Global Campaign for Education (GCE) that was created from the efforts of INGO's Action Aid, Oxfam GB, and Education International that wanted to set up a global coordinated funding initiative. The GCE promised to mobilize and create public pressure on governments to follow up on their promises to provide free high quality education for all people, especially for children and women (GCE 2009).

The NCE was formed as a product of the prolonged struggle of like-minded organizations, groups and individuals on the issues of education in India. The idea of establishing a national coalition in India initially began in 1996 when several of the current members began working together of the issue of EFA.

Composition

Since its official inception in 2002, the NCE has brought together a varied group of member organizations, uniting teachers unions, non-governmental organizations, and other social movements. At this time, the NCE has seven member organizations:

- All India Primary Teachers Federation (AIPTF), a union of more than 3 million primary teachers,
- All India Federation of Teachers Organization (AIFTO), a union of 1.2 million teachers,
